Don't worry if you don't do everything in here. Just do what you fancy and have fun!



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
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New Living Translation

Saul stayed with the believers in Damascus for a few days. And immediately he began preaching about Jesus in the synagogues, saying, "He is indeed the Son of God!" All who heard him were amazed. "Isn't this the same man who caused such devastation among Jesus' followers in Jerusalem?" they asked. "And didn't he come here to arrest them and take them in chains to the leading priests?" Saul's preaching became more and more powerful, and the Jews in Damascus couldn't refute his proofs that Jesus was indeed the Messiah. After a while some of the Jews plotted together to kill him.



They were watching for him day and night at the city gate so they could murder him, but Saul was told about their plot. So during the night, some of the other believers lowered him in a large basket through an opening in the city wall.



When Saul arrived in Jerusalem, he tried to meet with the believers, but they were all afraid of him. They did not believe he had truly become a believer! Then Barnabas brought him to the apostles and told them how Saul had seen the Lord on the way to Damascus and how the Lord had spoken to Saul. He also told them that Saul had preached boldly in the name of Jesus in Damascus. So Saul stayed with the apostles and went all around Jerusalem with them, preaching boldly in the name of the Lord. He debated with some Greekspeaking Jews, but they tried to murder him. When the believers heard about this, they took him down to Caesarea and sent him away to Tarsus, his

hometown. The church then had peace throughout Judea, Galilee, and Samaria, and it became stronger as the believers lived in the fear of the Lord. And with the encouragement of the Holy Spirit, it also grew in numbers.

Acts 9:19b-31

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Simple version

Saul stayed with the disciples for a while. He started preaching in the synagogues about Jesus. The people were surprised because it was Saul who had been sending believers to jail. The

Jews plotted to kill Saul. Saul heard about the plan and decided it was time to escape. The city's gates were being watched so Saul knew he could not get out that way. He was lowered down in a basket through an opening in the city walls. Saul went to Jerusalem, but the believers were afraid and suspicious of him. Barnabas found Saul and took him to the disciples, they believed him after hearing his story. Saul started telling the people of Jerusalem about Jesus, but many people did not believe him. The disciples took Saul back to his hometown of Tarsus.





After reading the story together, you could discuss these questions as a family:

- 1. Can you think of things that people have to escape from?
- 2. Why do you think Saul wanted to tell everyone that Jesus is the Son of God?
- 3. Why do you think some people wanted to stop Saul from saying this?
- 4. Who would you want to tell that Jesus is the Son of God?



Dear God, thank You for sending Jesus to the world. Thank You that Jesus is so special. Thank You for the people who told me that Jesus wants to be my friend. Amen.




SAUL of TARSUS escapes



God warned Saul not to leave the city through the gate, so he waited until it was dark and his friends took him to a window on the city wall.




Saul walked along the road to Jerusalem, thanking God for keeping him safe. He knew that some people would still be afraid of him because he had arrested so many Christians.

How many different things can you think of to say about Jesus?





To make you will need: Wool/yarn, scissors, hardback book (the length you want your person to be)

3. Cut the wool so that you have a long bunch of wool pieces all the same length.



4. Cut some small lengths of wool, you will use these strands to tie your person.



7. Divide the strands of wool into 3 parts, the 2 outside parts will be arms (20 strands each side) & a thicker bunch in the middle for body & legs.



11. Repeat steps 8,9,10 to make the second arm.

13,14,15 to make

the second leg.

10. Tie the arm tightly to


keep the plait in place &



Basket prayer

Some people in the world have to escape because of difficult things happening in their country. These people are refugees. Damascus is in Syria where there has been a war for eight years. The people of Damascus have had to escape the fighting. They have had to leave their homes and try to find a safer place to live.

You will need: A4 paper, colored paper strips, scissors, ruler, pencil What to do:

- Fold the A4 paper in half
- Draw a line about 2cm from the bottom of the folded paper closest to the opening.
- Draw lines about 2cm wide from the line to the centre of the paper - the fold.
- Cut along the lines.
- Write a prayer for people in different countries who have to escape on one of the coloured paper strips.
- Slot the paper strip through the slits you've cut in the paper.





Tell everyone in the house

You will need:

Messages written on small pieces of card or paper

Write the name of each person in your home on a card. On the other side write a nice message e.g. Jesus loves you. We hope you have a fun day. Thanks for being you. You make me smile etc



How to play:

Each member of the household hides in different rooms. The 'messenger' will deliver a different message to each person wherever they are hiding in the house. The message must be given to that person named on the card, no one else. The 'messenger' will be timed taking the messages around. Everyone has a turn to be the messenger. The person who takes the least time to deliver the messages is the winner.



Teddy parachutes

You will need:

- A small teddy bear or a soft toy
- a plastic bag
- string

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What to do:

- Cut a large square from the plastic bag
- Tie a piece of string (25cm) to each of the four corners
- Tie the other end of the strings to your teddy bear
- Ask an adult to help you launch your teddy bear from the top of the stairs or out of a window.
- Watch it fly to the ground.
