What is Baptism today?

- Is it necessary to be baptised in order to be a Christian?
- Is it necessary to be baptised for God to love you?
- Why were you baptised and what difference did it make you?

In the gospel story today we are hearing again the story of Jesus' baptism. Baptism would not have made Jesus any closer to God. In fact John tries to put him off, as John's baptism was for the forgiveness of sins which Jesus didn't need. (It was part of a ritual that sinful Jews went through). But today we believe that Jesus has taken away our sins so, do we need to be baptised today? Lots of questions, and today I hope to give you some answers.

Curates Corner

Epiphany - three voices and a dove

On Monday Helen and I went on our usual afternoon walk which takes us around the lake and onwards around the 'long walk' at Lydiard Park.
I think it's been many years since I've seen the lake at Lydiard frozen over.

In today's Gospel reading we find Jesus coming to be baptised in the water by John. (Matthew 3.13-17)
In the passage we hear three voices - that of John wondering why Jesus should be baptised (v.14) especially as he (Jesus), does not need it.
John's baptism was a baptism of repentance - signifying a turning away from (that unpopular idea of) sin and turning to God.
Jesus was perfect and sinless so why the need?

The other voice we hear is that of God the Son. (v.15), telling us of why he needs to be baptised.
Jesus' baptism is a baptism not of repentance, but of identification.
Jesus is looking to the cross where he identifies with us.
Where he, as the sinless one, would 'become sin for us' (2 Corinthians 5.21).

The other voice we hear is from God the Father who proclaims the Sonship of Jesus.
We also see God the Holy Spirit in action in the form of a dove (v.16).
The whole Trinity is up front and on display!

Later in Matthew's Gospel, we hear God the Father affirming God the Son, this time with the added command to 'listen to him'. Matthew 17. 1-8

As we get into 2026 proper whose voice(s) are you listening to?
May you listen to the only voice which is ultimately important and the one that really matters - the voice of Jesus. The one who speaks to you and says:
'Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest.' (Matthew 11.28)
