

Curates Corner

Advent 4: the coming king

Someone.

Over the last few weeks we have been clearing the loft space over our garage extension in readiness for repairs to the ceiling.

The original builders did not secure it properly and it's now split and coming loose from the beams.

Now if the room is to useable, something has to be done.

The good news of Advent is that we await the coming of a king who will make things right, who repairs and restores us.

A King who gives us value, who brings us a real sense of fulfilment, who brings purpose, hope and light in these increasingly dark and troubled times.

In order to repair fallen humanity, God did something. Jesus comes alongside us, as one of us - yet faultless and perfect.

His death and resurrection makes it possible for each of us to be forgiven, to have the cracks in our lives healed, the wounds of sin not just covered up, but removed and promises a new start - Jesus called this being 're-born' [John 3.7].

In his own words this King comes to:

"... to proclaim good news to the poor.

... to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour."

Luke 4.18-19
